COLORADO SPRINGS, CO. — **The Institute for Advanced Studies at Colorado Technical University** welcomes Hilary Bradbury-Huang to its Distinguished Lecturer Series at the Colorado Springs campus January 10, 2008 from 4-5pm in Room 250. Bradbury-Huang, who holds a Ph.D. in Management and a Masters in Philosophy, will be delivering her seminar entitled, *“Is it Easy to be Green: an Organizational Development Expert Considers the Changes Required by the Sustainability Revolution.”*

Hilary Bradbury-Huang serves on the Board of Trustees of Pasadena City College in Pasadena, California. She is Director of Sustainable Business Research Programs at the Center for Sustainable Cities at the University of Southern California. Her expertise is in the field of organizational change and the development of collaborative networks oriented toward sustainable development. She regularly teaches executive management programs both at USC and around the nation. When working with students and businesses, she uses an action research approach that cycles between collaborative intervention and reflection/theory building.

Bradbury-Huang partners with the principals of CleanAgency to offer 'CleanPractice,' a consultancy service for companies in need of advice and professional services related to becoming a sustainable enterprise. She is editor of *Action Research*, an international, interdisciplinary, peer-reviewed journal from Sage Publications. In addition, Hilary publishes in a variety of journals and is currently working on a book concerning the role of women in moving society toward a more sustainable state.

Bradbury-Huang is politically engaged and inspired by green values. Her work is committed to moving society toward increased sustainability, i.e., meeting the needs of the present without reducing the capacity of future generations to meet their needs. A member of the global Green Party, she works locally while considering herself a global citizen.
