Terry Armstrong, Ph.D. Promoted to Colorado Technical University Professor of Management

Colorado Springs, Colo., March 11, 2009 – Colorado Technical University (CTU)'s Institute for Advanced Studies (IAS) has announced the promotion of Terry Armstrong, Ph.D. to professor of management. In his new position, Armstrong will be responsible for instruction and curriculum development in addition to mentoring doctorate students and helping them to prepare articles for publication.

"Armstrong's background in experiential learning, as well as his experience in international business consulting, makes him highly qualified for the position of professor of management within the Institute for Advanced Studies," said Dr. Wallace Pond, CTU's chief executive officer. "In his new role, Terry will play a fundamental role in helping to expand and enhance CTU's doctorate management program."

Prior to joining CTU's IAS as an adjunct professor, Armstrong acquired extensive overseas consulting experience working for more than 100 organizations in 14 countries beginning in 1967 with an assignment in Columbia while attached to the Peace Corps. Armstrong has held several academic positions, including director of the MBA program at the University of West Florida, director of graduate education in communications at Emerson College, and director of the Arrupe program in social ethics for business at the Woodstock Theological Center at Georgetown University. Armstrong's experience also includes work as a senior strategy consultant with The Avery Group, in Pensacola, Fla., where he advised CEOs, senior executives and managers on a wide range of issues. In addition to his work at CTU, Armstrong volunteers his expertise with community organizations such as the Red Cross and the Colorado Springs Chamber of Commerce.

Dr. Armstrong received a doctorate in social science and philosophy from Union Graduate School and holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy from the University of Kansas.
