FINANCIAL AID GUIDE FOR MILITARY STUDENTS

If you are active duty, reserve, or a veteran service member, you may be thinking about earning a college degree as a way to potentially help you advance in your military or civilian career. The good news is there are a variety of financial aid programs—available to you and potentially your dependents—that can assist you with education expenses. Read on to learn how you can apply your military education benefits to complete your degree.





MILITARY EXPERIENCE HAS ITS BENEFITS

Your military service may qualify you and your dependents for education benefits that you are able to apply toward a college degree. The majority of financial aid available to military students is administered by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs in conjunction with the various branches of the armed services. When used in combination with traditional sources of federal and state student aid, up to 100% of tuition and eligible education expenses may be covered, which could give you and your dependents the opportunity to achieve your educational goals.

GET TO KNOW YOUR FINANCIAL AID OPTIONS

As a military or veteran student, you may have access to financial aid options that are not available to civilian students. Here are the most common ways you might receive tuition assistance to cover education expenses:

- ▶ Post 9/11 Gl Bill is an education benefit program for individuals who served on active duty or were honorably discharged from active duty after 9/11. Those eligible may receive up to 36 months of entitlement and may be eligible for benefits for 15 years from the last period of active duty.
- ▶ Montgomery GI Bill—Active Duty (MGIB-AD) also known as Chapter 30, provides education benefits to veterans and service members who have at least two years of active duty.
- ▶ Montgomery GI Bill—Selected Reserve (MGIB-SR) provides education benefits to eligible members of the selected reserve, including the Army Reserve, Navy Reserve, Air Force Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve, Coast Guard Reserve, Army National Guard and Air National Guard.
- ▶ The Yellow Ribbon Program is administered in conjunction with VA by participating degree-granting institutions, like CTU. The program is available to eligible veterans and dependents and provides additional funds for your education program without affecting your GI Bill entitlement.
- MyCAA Program is also known as Spouse Tuition Assistance and can provide up to \$4,000 of Financial Assistance to military spouses.
- ➤ Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance Program (DEA) provides education and training opportunities to eligible dependents and survivors of select veterans.

Reserve Educational Assistance Program (REAP) is an education benefit program for reserve and National Guard members. Eligibility is determined by the Department of Defense and Homeland Security.

Did you know?

CTU addresses the specific needs of active military, spouses and veterans by offering special tuition rates¹, scholarships² and grants for eligible students.

- Wounded Warrior Scholarship Program annually provides full tuition for an online degree program to 25 wounded service members and 25 spouses of wounded service members. Learn more at <u>www.coloradotech.edu/</u> admissions/military/wounded-warrior-scholarship
- ▶ Liberty Grant is available to veterans of the US Armed Forces and their eligible spouses. The grant is based on financial need and is worth up to 5% for Associate, Bachelor's and Master's programs and 10% for Doctoral programs. STEPS TO DETERMINE ELIGIBILITY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Once you have been admitted into the university of your choice, your next step is to work with a financial aid advisor to determine eligibility for aid. At CTU, you can connect with a Military Education Benefits Specialist (MEBS), who will work with you on your individual eligibility plan.

You may be asked to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), at fafsa.edu.gov. If you're a military student seeking military education benefits, it is recommended that you connect with your Education Service Officer (ESO) on base.

The FAFSA is used to determine your eligibility to receive a variety of financial aid—from Federal grants and loans to work-study opportunities. The office of Federal Student aid estimates that it will take, on average, 55 minutes to complete an initial FAFSA application online. To expedite the process, you'll need a FSA ID to electronically sign the FAFSA online.



Also gather all pertinent information such as your social security number, tax returns, W-2s, bank statements and other financial documents. Visit the FAFSA website for a list of all required documents.

Whether you are an active duty, reserve, or veteran service member, your military training and service experience may be eligible for transfer credit which can reduce your tuition and time to graduation.³ Learn more at **coloradotech.edu/admissions/military/credit-transfer**.
