BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (RN TO BSN) COMPLETION PROGRAM

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN-to-BSN) completion program provides several opportunities for prospective students to reduce the total program length and total tuition cost through credit for academic or other experiences. Upon receipt, official transcripts or other documentation will be reviewed by CTU's Registrar Evaluation Services Department to determine transfer credit eligibility into the RN-to-BSN program followed by any cost adjustments.

- Up to 90 quarter credits may be accepted as transfer credit with the required incoming Associate Degree in Nursing, Diploma Registered Nurse (RN), or a graduate-entry educational transition program preparing students for eligibility to become licensed as a Registered Nurse.
- 28.5 quarter credits may be awarded toward degree completion requirements for a valid Registered Nurse (RN) license.
- Additional credits may be awarded for national nursing specialty certifications.
- An experiential learning portfolio may be reviewed for additional credit. Program credits and total program cost may be reduced if an experiential learning portfolio is approved for credit.

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The table below provides examples of possible scenarios. The cost for each student will be determined after a review of credit opportunities listed above.

Total Program Cost and program length assume a student will be awarded the maximum credit for transfer, licensure, prior experiential learning, and professional certifications, will be continuously enrolled, and will satisfactorily complete all program requirements for graduation. Tuition and timing reflect an accelerated pace for the nursing component of the program. Additional courses, such as general education requirements, may be necessary dependent on credits transferred to CTU. Nursing students may be required to complete a background check prior to beginning their clinical work; any fees associated with the pre-clinical background check are the student's responsibility.

DOCTOR OF NURSING PRACTICE*

The Doctor of Nursing Practice program provides opportunities for prospective students to reduce the total program length and total tuition cost through credit from previous clinical practice. All DNP graduates must complete 1,000 clinical hours at the post-baccalaureate level. Five hundred of those hours will be clinical immersion hours completed while attending CTU. All DNP students are required to enter the program with at least 120 clinical hours. For students that do not have

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the remaining 380 clinical hours to transfer in, CTU provides DNP Transitions courses. Each Transitions course awards approximately 1 quarter credit hour per every 30 clinical practice hours. The table below provides examples of possible scenarios. The cost for each student will be determined after a review of the clinical hours completed before entering the program.

NOTES:

1. Program tuition is charged per credit hour at the beginning of each term throughout the student's program. Each academic term is 10 weeks and includes two 5 week sessions.
2. Total Program Cost displayed is based upon the total number of credits in a degree program. Fees charged by the University are included in the Total Program Cost. The total number of credits taken at Colorado Technical University may vary due to transfer credits, block transfer, repeated courses, or multiple concentrations. Students possessing an earned Associate

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degree from an accredited institution at the time of admission to Colorado Technical University may be eligible for a block transfer of credits into select Bachelor's degree programs. See the Degree Programs section of the University Catalog for descriptions of the degree programs.

3. The University reserves the right to change tuition and fees during the course of an academic year. As such, a student's financial aid packaging may be subject to adjustment to account for these monetary changes.
4. Total Program Cost includes a custom suite of course materials which are provided to the student by Words of Wisdom, LLC. At the University's discretion, books may be delivered in an electronic (e-Book), which may be accessed by the student for the duration of the applicable course(s) or standard textbook, which becomes the property of the student. Students not wishing to use e-Books are responsible for any additional charges associated with purchasing standard textbooks.
5. The Technology Fee is \$220 per term (non-refundable). The Technology Fee covers student access to and maintenance of the following University systems: Student Portal, Virtual Classroom, Intellipath® adaptive learning platform, CTU Mobile App, CTU Messenger, e-Book reader, and student email. Students utilizing VA education benefits will be exempt from this fee.
6. For students enrolled in the Bachelor of Science in Computer Engineering program, a \$1,100 non-refundable Engineering Fee will be charged to the student's account in the term in which the student is registered for the first engineering (EE) course and is included in the Total Program Cost. This fee does not cover the cost of these required items: safety goggles, one Phillips head screwdriver, one flat head screwdriver, and one set of needle nose pliers with side cover; it is the student's responsibility to purchase these items. Engineering students are also responsible for purchasing any replacement parts listed on the Engineering Parts List; this list is available to students to assist in purchasing replacement parts.
7. A \$1,000 non-refundable Doctoral Symposium Fee is charged to a student's account each term in which a student is registered for an in-person Doctoral Symposium event. This fee covers costs associated with hosting the symposium event including academic materials and supplies and is included in the Total Program Cost. Students attending the in-person Doctoral Symposium are responsible for booking and paying their own travel and lodging expenses and therefore not covered by the Doctoral Symposium Fee. Doctoral students are required to attend two Doctoral Symposium events in their program. Students registered for the virtual Doctoral Symposium events offered by the University are not subject to the Doctoral Symposium Fee. Please see the Doctoral Symposium section of the University Catalog for more information.
8. A non-refundable Graduation Fee will be charged to the student's account during their final term and is included in the Total Program Cost. The Graduation Fee covers one diploma and diploma cover, two official university transcripts, honor cord (if applicable), regalia (if the graduate is attending a ground commencement ceremony), and costs related to the production of the annual ground commencement ceremony. In order to participate in a ground commencement ceremony, each eligible student must complete the entire graduation process by the published deadline. Students who fail to register by the deadline will forfeit the opportunity to receive regalia and participate in a ground commencement ceremony. Regardless of ceremony participation, all graduates will receive their diploma kit at their home address approximately 6-8 weeks following their final term (provided all financial and academic obligations are met).

Cost of Attendance

The cost of attendance (COA), is the average academic year education-related cost for attending a program at an institution of higher education. Expected charges include direct costs, such as tuition and fees, and indirect costs, such as room and board, travel, books and supplies, and other personal expenses. The COA will differ based on various circumstances, such as your enrollment status and living situation. Students living with their parents should reference the 'With Parent' components below. All other students should reference the 'Off-campus' components below.

Below are the COA components for the 2025-26 academic year. At CTU, a full time academic year consists of three terms which is generally eight months in length.
